#### **General Information**

Presented in this report are results from the exit survey.

**Exit Survey**: The exit survey collects information regarding the graduates' current employment status, future educational plans, their achievement of specific goals and Excelsior University's impact on those goals, their level of satisfaction with the University, importance and satisfaction with resources provided at Excelsior University, their achievement of general education outcomes, and achievement of the program's student learning outcomes. The survey also solicits graduates' perceptions of program strengths and suggestions for change.

Questions related to the exit survey or to the design and production of this report may be addressed to the Director of Reporting and Surveys.

**Interpreting Results:** Care should be taken in interpreting survey results. Survey results can be affected by self-selection bias, in which persons with certain characteristics or opinions are more likely to respond. Particular caution should be taken when the numbers of responses are small because results may be skewed.

Please consider the following guidelines when interpreting survey data:

<u>Means:</u> When results are expressed in a chart or table of means, please note the range of values and their meanings, which are listed in a footnote below the chart or table. In general, mean values of 4 or higher on a 6-point Likert scale are considered positive. Similarly, a mean value of 5 or higher is considered positive on a 7-point scale. Throughout the report, means are calculated only for Likert-type items that received five or more responses.

<u>Standard deviations:</u> Wherever mean values are presented, please also consider the standard deviations (SD) that accompany them. Standard deviation is a measure of variability in the response to a survey item, such that a small SD indicates less variation (more agreement) among respondents.

<u>Frequency tables:</u> As noted above, means are calculated only for Likert-type items that received five or more responses. If fewer than five were received, responses will be displayed in frequency tables, with a numerical count provided for each response. Where charts display survey items in pairs (such as ratings of program outcomes), both items will be displayed in a frequency table if either received fewer than five responses.






Please indicate how <u>important</u> each aspect of the Excelsior University experience was to you and how <u>satisfied</u> you were with it. (Mean ratings)





- I think the strengths of the nursing program at Excelsior are forming a community within the program. meeting classmates from all diverse and ethnic backgrounds that collectively attribute to the learning process.
- I was able to accomplish my degree and work excessive hours at the same time. I could not have done it in a classroom situation.
- My ability to write proper care plans, and apply critical thinking skills.
- Myself, I was self motivated to finish. Most of the Professors wanted us to succeed.

- The clinical instructors were phenomenal. The instructors for the most part were great, very helpful and knowledgeable, but several of the faculty need to improve on online communication, and how to impart information so that their wishes are established and can be followed. The online system and the rubrics did not always match up, and it made it very confusing for the students, and one of the instructors actually stopped fielding questions all together because she didn't like how many messages she was receiving about things.

# What <u>changes</u> (additions or subtractions) would you recommend that Excelsior University make to the program? (N = 39)

#### Comments:

- 1.) cost of class materials/books
  - 2.) please find a different scrub set. Purple bottoms are hard to find, and white tops are transparent, as well as easily soiled.
  - 3.) the course load for the last class is absolutely bonkers.
  - 4.) group projects need to be at a minimum and have a longer time frame to complete. It is incredibly hard to zoom with classmates, ho are all LPN's working various shifts, in various time-zones.
  - 5.) prior to the curriculum change, I had a nasty professor for one of my classes. I shouldn't be bullied by my professor when I'm paying an exorbitant amount of money for the classes
  - 6.) My advisor should be FIRED. She did nothing to help me. She did not thoroughly or directly answer my questions. She frequently gave me misinformation or did not give me all of the information that I needed. She would leave out crucial details, if she responded at all.
  - 7.) Why am I taking m boards in SEPTEMBER when I finished classes in JUNE?! Something needs to be done about this conferral process, at least for nursing students. You shouldn't have to wait 3 months to sign up for your boards. Plus, the longer it takes to take them, the less likely you are to pass. The wait and the entire process was ridiculous.

I will never attend Excelsior again. Nursing instructors (for the mot part), phenomenal. Course content, amazing. The cost, the bureaucracy, my good-for-nothing advisor, the issues I had with financial aid, and the wait to take my boards were all significant issues impacting my poor perception of this school.

- ACCREDITATION
- ACEN accreditation for the AS, AAS program as to avoid hiring issues in certain states.
- Add more clinical experiences.
- After completing my coarses 6/26. I had to wait till 8/19 for graduation. After that I had to wait for my transcripts to get to North Carolina 8/29, before I could get my authorization to test. And by the time there us a test opening 9/22, it is almost 3 months from finishing. During my last few classes with excelsior it was drilled to tale boards in 1-2 months. That is not even possible! The whole graduation/getting transcripts process needs to be re evaluated. There is no reason i should have to wait this long before my transcripts are sent off. Your college is so expensive and to top I off I have to spend more money for a refresher coarse, because I had to wait so long to get the ATT. I am so annoyed with the process you college has! It is ridiculous! There is a lack of communication since changing the curriculum it is horrible! Even after talking to my nursing advisor, she had NO idea what was going on and how to help. Please, please provide your current student with more information and give graduates a sooner "graduation date" to take the NCLEX sooner!! If you wonder why people don't pass the NCLEX, that is why!!
- Be more generous when awarding credits. Whoever decides what to accept is nitpicky. I
  would have continued right through my masters, but I'm not repeating dumb classes like
  history and religion.

- Clearer degree plans and keeping advisors up to date on degree plan changes
- Get ACEN accredited again. I would love to have ACEN accreditation on my degree. I think it is important when transferring to BSN programs and moving forward with my education.
- I did not like the ATI program- I thought that the 2 day review was very helpful, but I did not like the teaching/testing materials. I purchased a program on my own to prepare for nclex.
- I enjoy my experience. I would not take away anything.
- I feel that the most positive change that you have made to the nursing program was to remove the CPNE and allow the students to attend clinical experiences at hospitals.
- I had a problem at the end with certain projects that I believe had nothing to do with nursing, such as making a slide show over Diversity, Inclusiveness and Equity, with is a political concept, not a nursing one. Nursing is a profession where we already care for all people. This is why we are nurses. DEI is a part of the problem we have in our political arena today, and why the country is divided.
- I recommend more zoom meetings and class interaction with other students. I found zoom meets very beneficial.
- I would incorporate online classroom teaching face to face. I went to college online and felt I
  taught myself with so many of the classes. Students could use guidance with more of
  classroom type of environment.
- I would say that there could be some didactics that would common language and practice
  expressing verbally common requests. The medical speak is important with doctors and other
  professionals. It demonstrates confidence and knowledge with the ability to verbalize.
- I would strongly suggest speeding up the process of verifying transcripts and conferring degrees especially in a program that strongly recommends taking your boards for licensing with in 90 days of completion. My last class was Dec 18th my transcripts / degree was not conferred until Feb 17 and as on March 8th I am still awaiting to be authorized to test, 10 days away from the recommended limit of 90 days. I am aware that states do things differently however if I had not had to wait 60 days for my degree to be conferred and my transcripts to even be sent, I could at least have obtained a temporary practice permit allowing me to utilize my degree to some extent.
- Implement lectures, or power points to reinforce the reading. All we were given was chapters to read, and a quiz once a week and most weeks I didn't know what we were learning because I gotten no instruction.
- Less time spent on making power point presentations (NUR290)
   Less time spent in all nursing courses spent on cultural sensitivity. School should consider making this one complete course. Need more pathology and med Surg learning instead.
- More clinical days to practice hands on skills and to maybe create clinical case studies in real life for hands on practice.
- More clinical experience and locations. Use of employment for clinical experience
- More clinical experience
   Not changing the program and books mid program.
- More clinicals
- More communication from upper level management.
- More flexible dates for Mandatory Zoom as sometimes they interfered with travel to NY for required weekend testing.
- More interaction with students, more FaceTime elements between students and professors.
- More than one class at a time, lower cost. Instructors who speak English for onsite hospital preceptors.

Preceptors who do not treat students as if they are not knowledgeable and purposely try to make them fail!

- None at this time.
- None, I think it is an excellent program.
- Nothing is every clear in this program. EVerything is confusing and when you ask an instructor for help you are told read the rubric. Well, every teacher interperates the rubric different and each teacher grades different. I felt I had no support or preparation from this school. i only learned things from my own teaching, peer help and clinical. AT least 60% of instructors didn't even respond to questions for days. Most students in this school work full time and do not have days to wait for a response. This school needs to be better at clear communication. EAch class should have the same rubric and a list of books that need to be purchased in advance. i had a few classes where my digital books didn't come through till I was in a week of the class. That did not set me up for success.
- Price of tuition is so much along with all the books needed. The distance I had to travel for the clinicals was crazy. Excelsior definitely needs to add more clinical sites across the US.
- Quit harassing students to take a million surveys all the time. If they don't respond in the first 10 requests they are likely not interested in taking pointless surveys. Like all universities, Excelsior is all about money and less about students success.
- The advisement department needs to be overhauled, and the website needs to be revamped to show incoming students when they will be able to take their boards. I had no idea that I would have to wait nearly 3 months to even qualify for my boards, and no other school I've ever heard of makes their students wait that long. My entire group had no idea until about 2 weeks before we should have actually graduated.
- The instructors, there's a few instructors who made the entire program too stressful and more diversity with the professors/
- The tuition can be cost prohibitive.
- There is no reason to conferral should take two months.
- There needs to be clearer instructions within each class in terms of assignments, readings etc. Would also benefit from utilizing online lectures for better enforcement on each topics.
- They should have a person in charge of a diversity department or an affirmative action office of some sort. They should take racism more seriously and they should take racist complaints more seriously. There should never be a racist investigator that's in charge of investigating racist crimes by both students and teachers.
- Timely communications and reminders on important dates and deadlines. I missed my 2nd clinicals since I hadn't renewed some documents. I thought they would be automatically be accepted since I had used them in the first clinicals.
- Weekly zoom class in Phase-I and II of nursing classess to clarify if students have any difficulties
